DISCONTINUANCE OF INTERNATIONAL STUDIES CO-MAJOR

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of Governors discontinue the International Studies Co-Major, effective December 31, 2017. The final semester that students will be able to graduate with an International Studies co-major will be Fall 2017.

Program Description

The International Studies co-major is an interdisciplinary co-major that has been housed in the English Language Institute. The Institute Director, Bruce Morgan, has advised students in the co-major. Students have taken coursework across the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences to satisfy co-major requirements.

Rationale

The Global Studies major and minor were designed to replace the International Studies co-major after the co-major program was reviewed in 2013-2014. Because the Global Studies major and minor are now open for enrollment (effective in Fall 2016), the International Studies co-major is no longer needed. The Global Studies major and minor are housed in Classical and Modern Languages, Linguistics and Cultures (CMLLC). CMLLC has hired a Global Studies Director, and many other CMLLC faculty are teaching the core courses for the new programs.

Accommodations for Current Students

Current co-majors who are unable to finish their coursework by December 2017 are being advised to switch to a Global Studies minor, which can accommodate most of the coursework they have completed for the co-major. Current co-majors were already contacted with this information in Spring 2016 and again in Fall 2016. No new students have been allowed to declare the International Studies co-major, effective Fall 2016. Students are instead being encouraged to declare the Global Studies major or minor.
