History

• 1920: founded as the Merrill-Palmer Motherhood and Training School at the Freer House



- 1922: third nursery school in the United States
- 1981: joins Wayne State University as Merrill Palmer Institute
- 2005: Skillman Center for Children is integrated forms MPSI
- For over a century, the Institute has trained generations of parents, teachers, students, and researchers across the nation and world

Training Programs

- MPSI Fellowship Program
 - 9 multi-disciplinary graduate fellows
 - 5 trainees (pre-candidacy)







Founded in July 2020, Science Policy Network-Detroit (SciPol-Detroit) aims to advocate for science and evidence-based policies, provide science communication, advocacy, and career development opportunities, encourage community efficacy, and bridge the gap between scientists, lawmakers, and the lay public.

- Infant Mental Health Dual Title
 - First program of this kind in U.S.
 - 34 multi-disciplinary students

Professional Development & Training



- Explorations In Development: 2-day conference, ~125 early childhood professionals
- Baby Court: training for ~125 professionals in family courts and child welfare
- Hearts & Minds on Babies: training for ~40 early childhood teachers and childcare providers
- Integrated Pediatric Care: training for > 600 healthcare providers



Support for Families and Youth

- Parenting Moments: digital newsletter for parents and caregivers; reaches >1,000
- Infant and Early Childhood Mental Health: professional services to assess and treat families with a variety of needs by 10 students in 8-10 community settings for 30+ families
- Giant Step Teen Conference: >200 teens plus ~50 school personnel from diverse backgrounds join annually to learn new perspectives





The Early Childhood Center

- On site 5-star accredited early childhood center
- 2 classrooms for preschool-age children (30-40 total)
- Training site for student assistants, educators, speechlanguage specialists, occupational therapists, and others
- Grants support free attendance for income-eligible families and Pell-grant eligible WSU student parents
