ESTABLISHMENT OF THE MARIE DRAPER DYKES ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of Governors establish the Marie Draper Dykes Endowed Scholarship.

The scholarship fund will recognize scholastic achievement, encourage continued progress, and provide assistance to students in financing their education in the College of Nursing.

Background

The Marie Draper Dykes Endowed Scholarship in nursing at Wayne State University honors the late Dr. Marie Draper Dykes, nurse educator and administrative official. For almost all of her adult life, Marie Draper Dykes was a part of Wayne State University. As an undergraduate student at Wayne State, she received the Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree in 1964. She was a research assistant in the College of Nursing in 1965 and 1966. After receiving her Master of Science in Nursing and doing post-masters study at the University of California San Francisco Medical Center from 1966 to 1967, she returned to Michigan and began teaching at Wayne as assistant professor of nursing in 1967, a position she kept throughout her career at the university. She was a full-time faculty member until 1971, when she received an appointment as administrator in the office of the Vice President for Academic Administration, rising over the years from assistant dean to associate provost. She served in that office for thirty-five years, during the administrations of four university presidents and fifteen or more vice presidents for Academic Administration. Her work helped provide continuity and direction to a university growing in size, complexity and service to the State of Michigan. She maintained a life-long interest not only in Wayne State University, but also in teaching and the practice of nursing.

Background

The Ledge/Palmer group writes:

“In typical form, an endowment is the gift of a single person, often well known in his or her own community. Yet the endowment may come as a surprise to even those that think they know the giver best. In surprise, then, is another legacy, that what we own, not given only to our own kin, connects unknown persons, despite all impediments.

It is in this spirit of generosity, and surprise, that we, the LEDGE-PALMER alumni group, act as a unified hand extended to students of various arts at Wayne State University. We have chosen artistic expression to encourage because we have each benefited from our own artistic efforts or we have reaped the rewards of listening to and watching each other. We attended each other’s concerts. We played music together. We posed for photographs. We danced. We lived as touched by each other’s practice.

Of course we did not know all this at the time, in the early to mid-1970s. We only knew ourselves to be vaguely happy sitting and talking on the “ledge” between the music building and Community Arts Auditorium and/or living in the petri dish known as Palmer House. Subsequently we have had two reunions that have reaffirmed our college experiences as a growth medium. Those of our group who have passed on have given us impetus to proceed with this endowment. We are, we think and feel, more than the sum of our parts. It is our own love and respect for each other, despite accumulated small irritations and annoyances, which any human assembly would feel in the course of thirty five years’ association, that we wish to convey in the act of establishing this small endowment, now and in perpetuity.”

This scholarship fund is established to recognize scholastic achievement, encourage continued progress and provide assistance to students in financing their education in the School of Business Administration.

Background

Randolph "Randy" Paschke is the director of external relations and community engagement and former chair of the Department of Accounting at the Wayne State University School of Business Administration. Mr. Paschke served as chair of the Department of Accounting from September 2002 to May 2012, sharing his extensive knowledge of accounting and taxation with hundreds of business students and aspiring accounting professionals. He is committed to introducing young students to the possibility of careers in accounting, and he has worked closely with the university and the local metropolitan Detroit community to create and promote information programs for high school students. His teaching interests include individual and corporate taxation, international taxation, and the impact taxes have on business strategy.

Mr. Paschke has spent more than 30 years in the public accounting profession. He is a licensed certified public accountant and customs broker. He was a partner at Arthur Anderson LLP for 20 years, leading the firm's Michigan tax practice from 1987 to 1996, the Great Lakes region international tax practice from 1998 to 2000, and the United States international tax and trade practice from 2000 to 2002.

**ESTABLISHMENT OF THE SCHOOL OF SOCIAL WORK
DEAN'S ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP**

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of Governors establish the School of Social Work Dean's Endowed Scholarship.

The scholarship fund is established to support students in the School of Social Work.

Background

At present, the School of Social Work has five donor-contributed student loan funds that are underutilized and/or which have not been used at all in recent years. This situation exists, in part, because the interest rates and terms for market driven loans in today's economic environment are more preferable than those the university can offer independently.

The School of Social Work requests conversion of these underutilized and unused funds into an endowed scholarship. This conversion will help to stem the increasing debt of students, while creating scholarship dollars that can be awarded annually in perpetuity.

The School of Social Work Dean's Endowed Scholarship will be established with a total of \$34,994 in the following loan funds: Everett Beishlag Memorial Loan Fund, Charles B. Brink Loan Fund, Bette Kalichman Student Loan Fund, Aaron Mendelson Memorial Fund, and the School of Social Work Alumni Association Emergency Student Aid Fund. The documentation for each of these funds allows such change in purpose.
