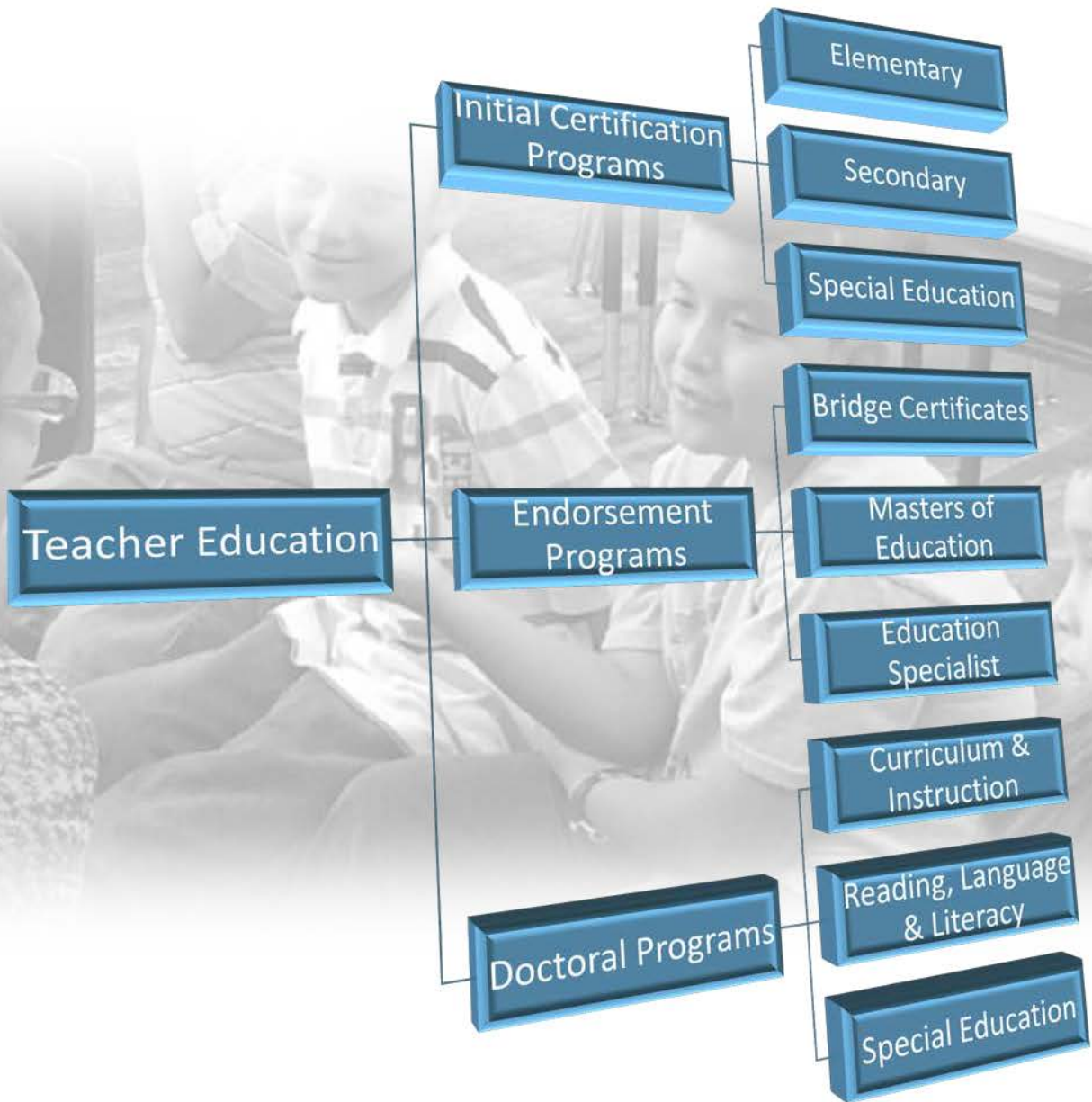

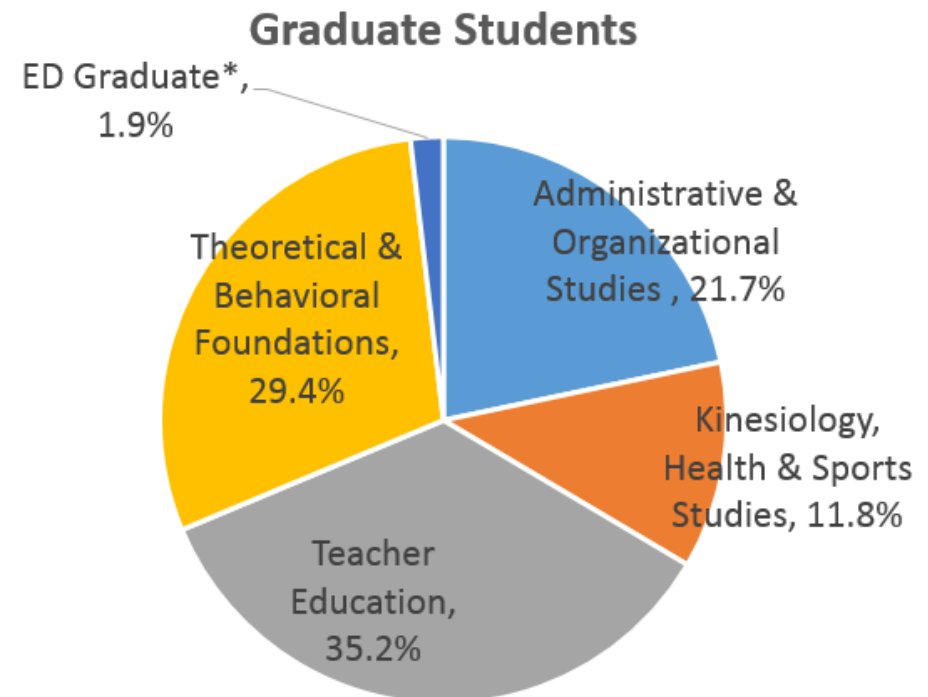
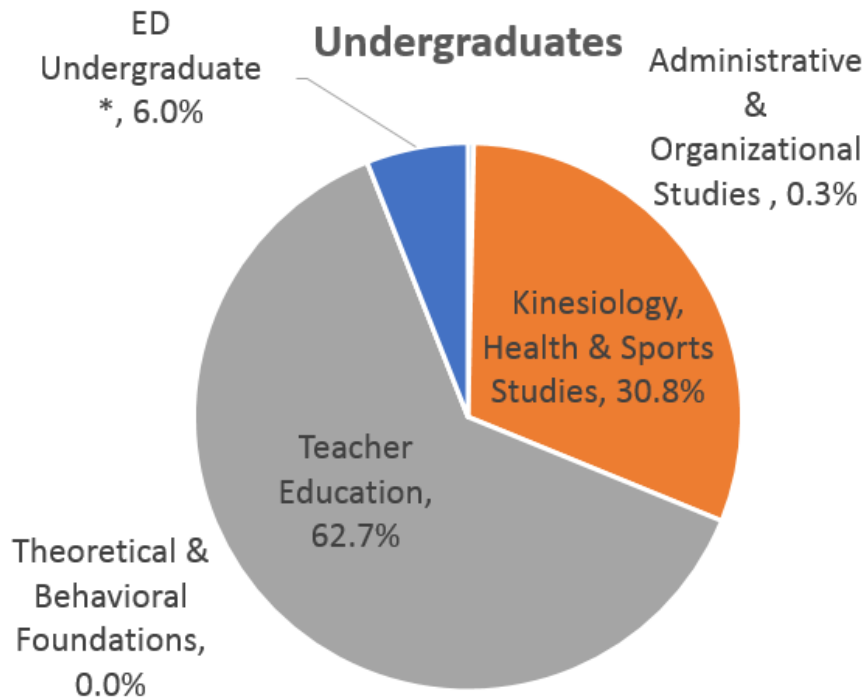

College of Education Undergraduates & Graduate Students by Division (Fall, 2015)

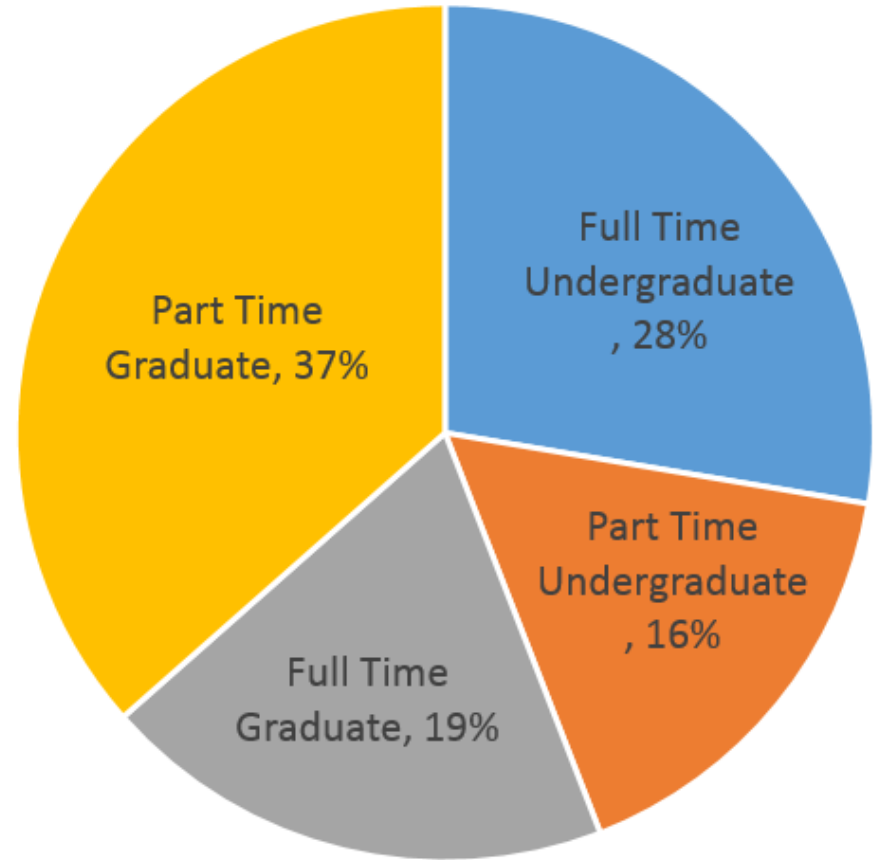

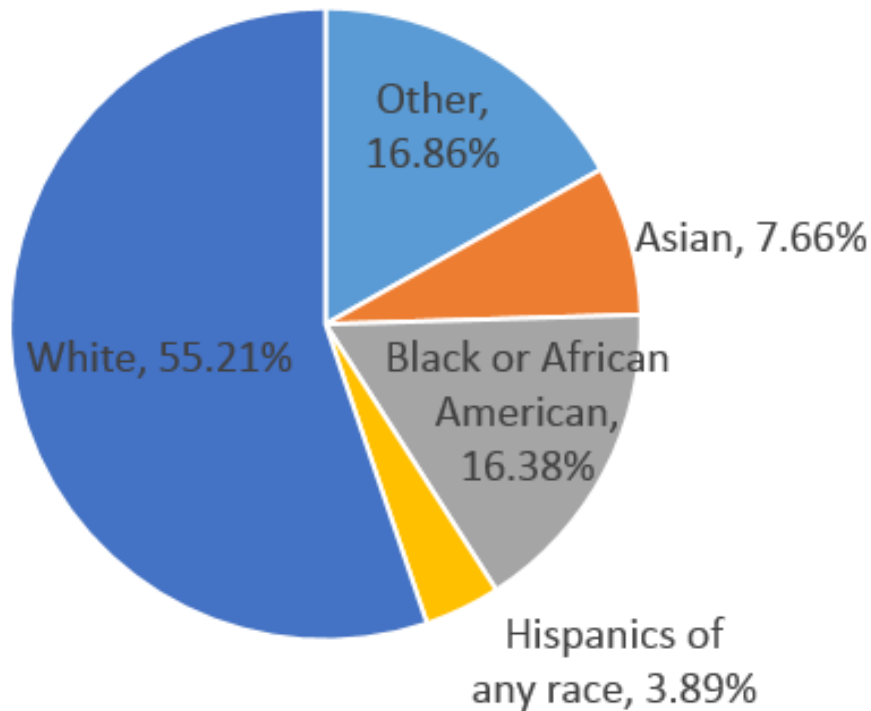
College of Education Students (Fall, 2015)

- 20% of WSU's Enrolled Graduate Students

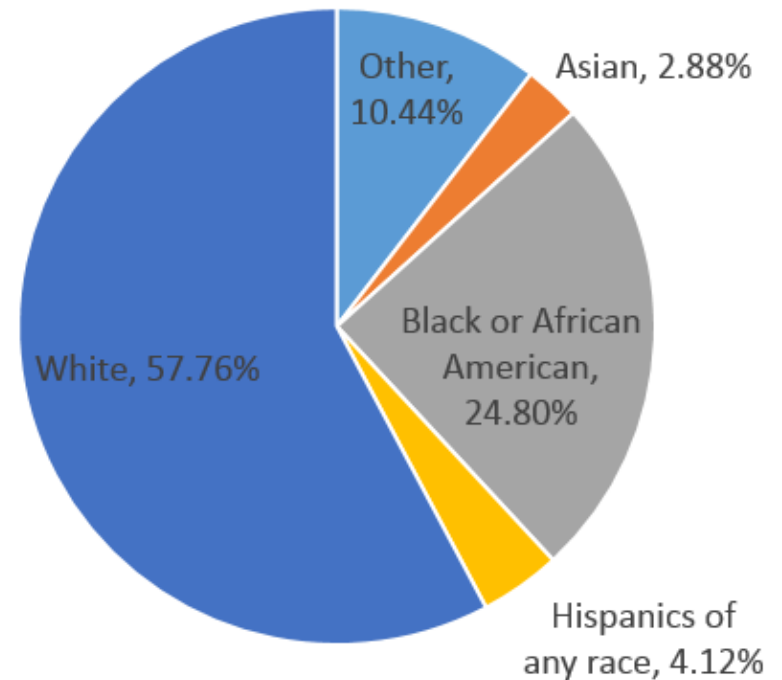


Ethnicity of students (Fall 2015) at Wayne State and the College of Education

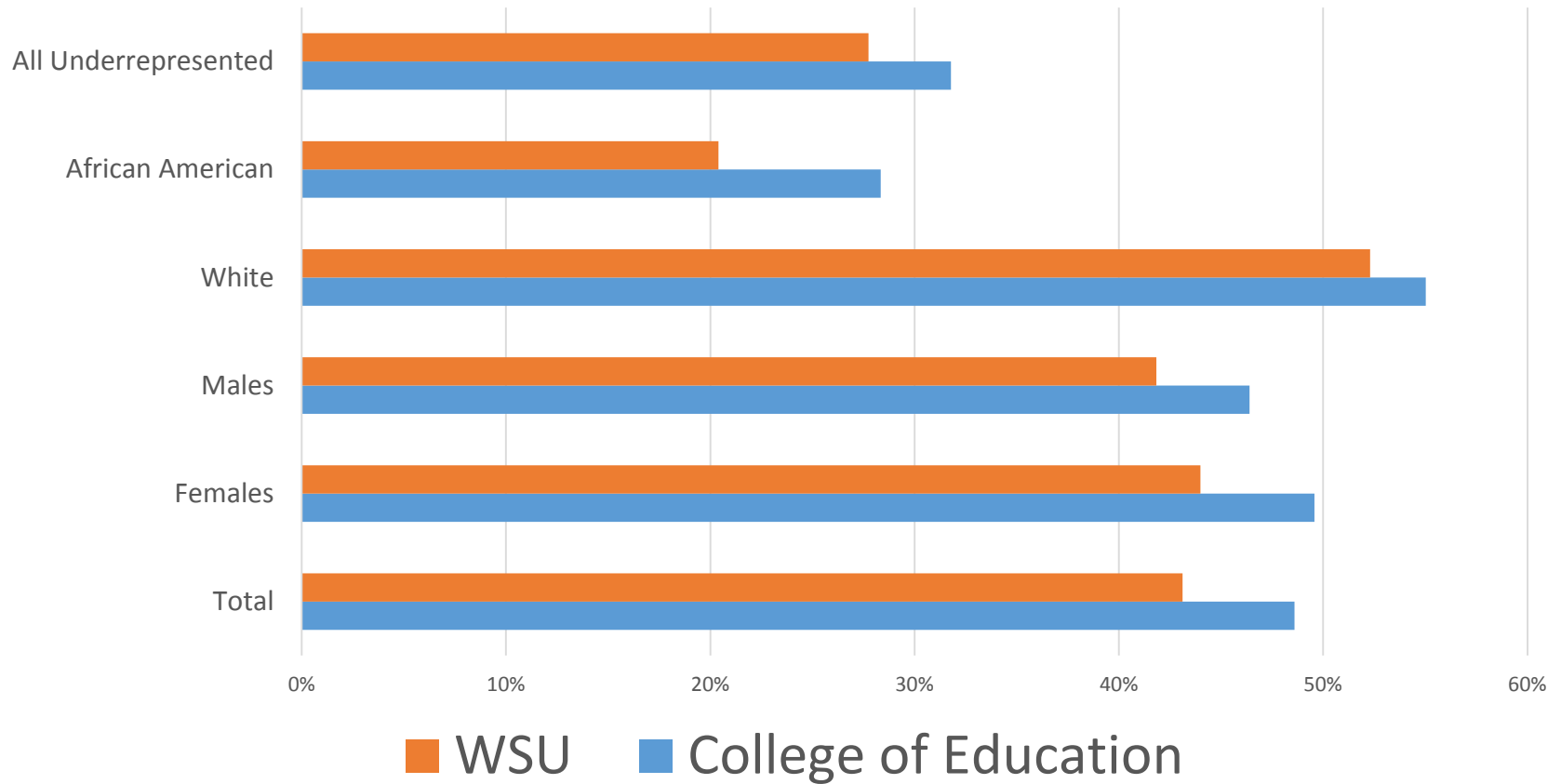

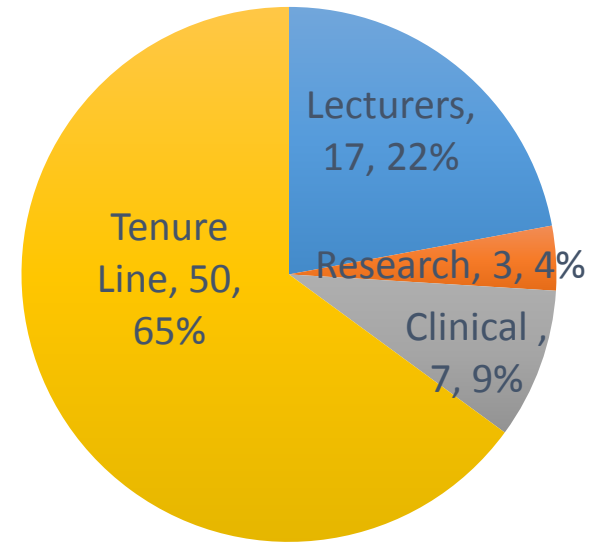


Six Year Graduation Rate for All New Students

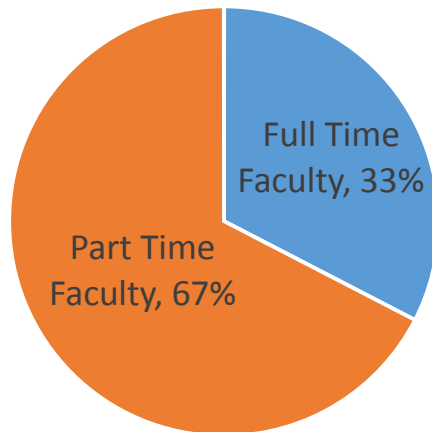

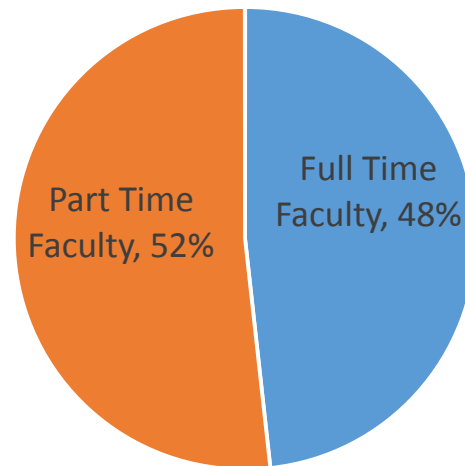

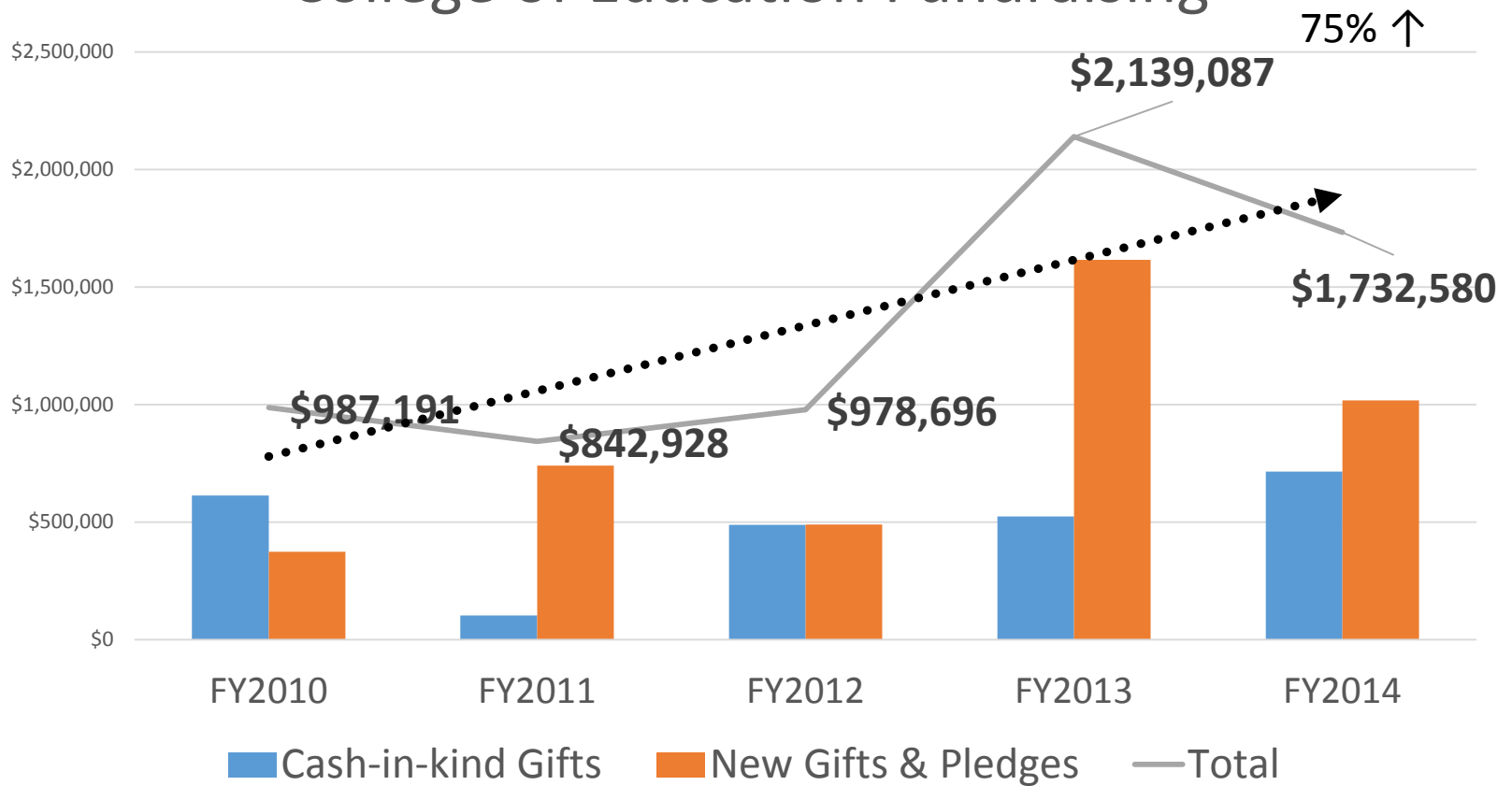

Challenges

- Nationwide drop in students entering the teaching profession
 - Years of national attack on school teachers
 - Decreasing Detroit population
 - Increased competition from Michigan Colleges of Education
 - State elimination of planned continuing education after certification
- Accreditation agencies, Licensing boards, and State requirements limit the ability to reduce programs or modify them substantially
- Need for marketing by the college
- Increased research mission of Wayne State
- Limited physical resources (College of Education, Old Main, FAB, Appelbaum, Matthaei)

Enrollment Initiatives in 2015

- Learning Communities
- Outreach to CLAS advisors & to Community College Advisors
- **Direct Marketing to Undergraduate Majors**
- Teacher MEd Scholarships (50% tuition for first 12 credits) with Metro Bureau
- Seminars and Workshops (ex. financial aid seminar, Job Search Strategies)
- Return to Wayne Program
- Increased college scholarships
- Student Ambassadors
- Tutoring Assistance (Testing Prep, Boot Camp, Special Ed)
- Peer mentoring
- Open Advising
- Encouragement of students to attend conferences and seminars
- Personal contact of stop-outs by faculty
- Increased visibility through campus and Metropolitan events
- Improved Webpage: Hotjar for inquiries, Blog (jobs and careers)

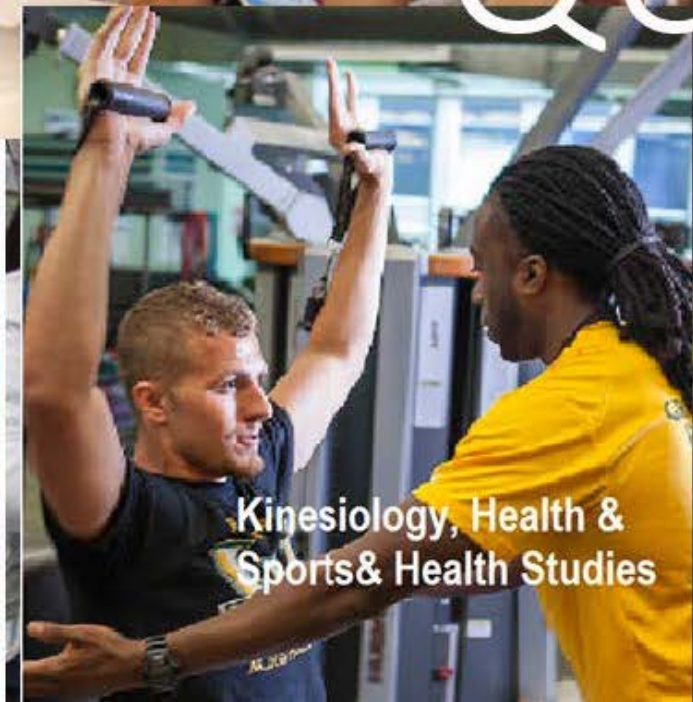

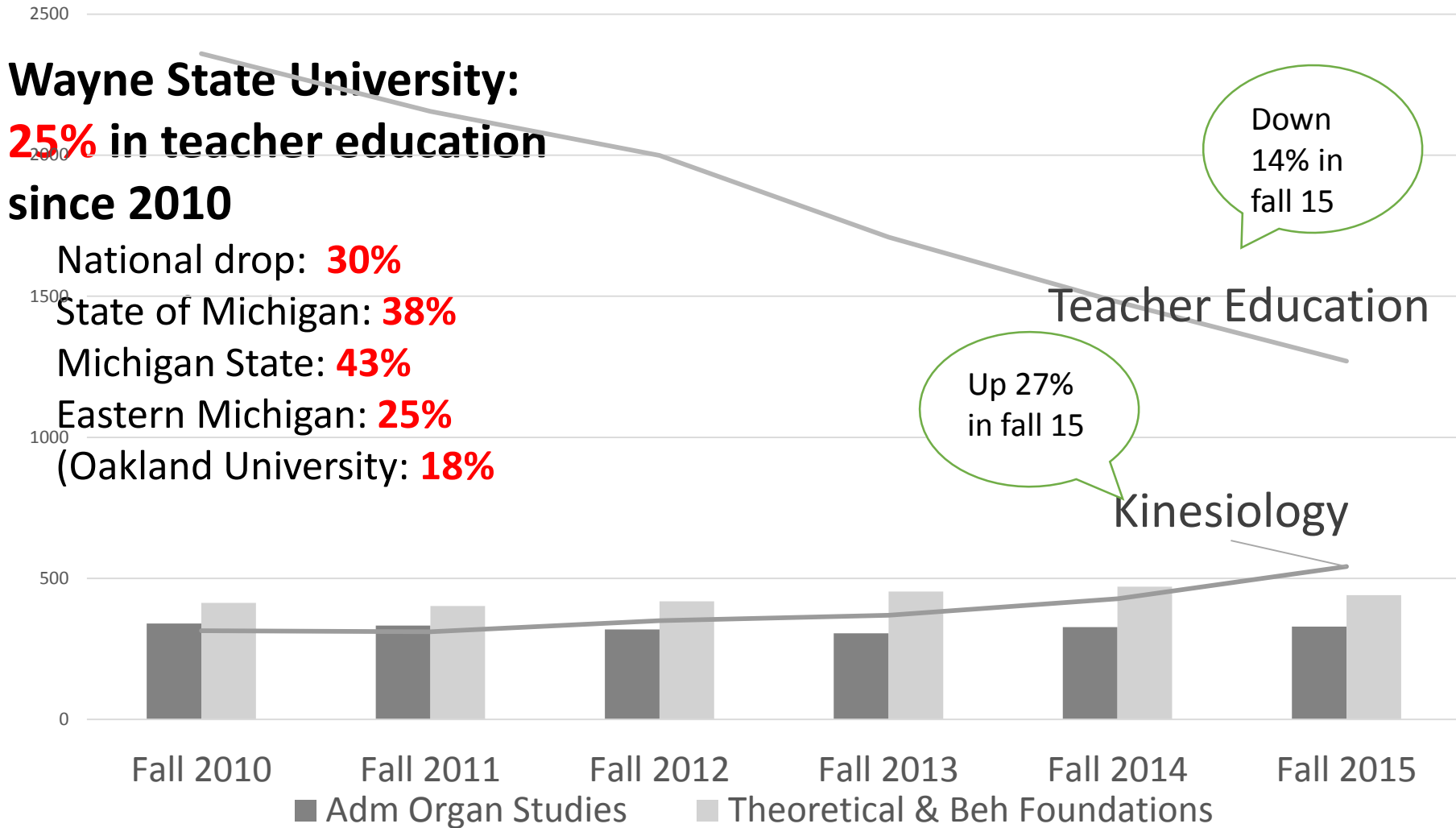

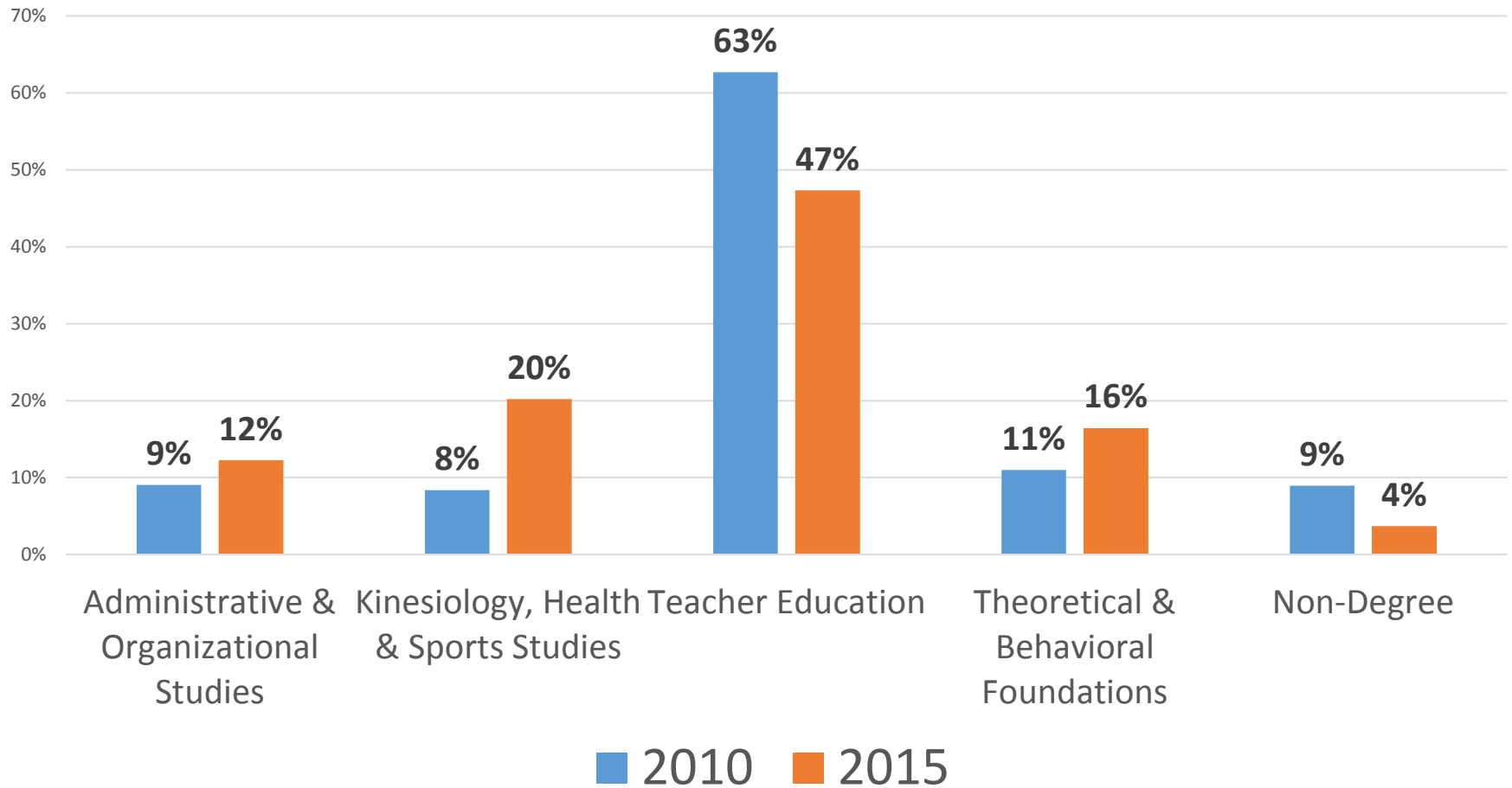
