
APEX Mission

APEX Scholars 2.0

Beginning with Summer and Fall 2015 Cohort

Earlier Registration for Fall Term

- Orientation with rest of WSU Freshmen (helps reduce stigma)
- Push to 1st WSU Orientation Sessions (much better course selection, allows for schedule blocks)

Blocked-courses vs designated sections

- APEX students in class with other WSU students (helps reduce stigma, but facilitates study groups)
- Blocked study time for organized study groups

Enhanced Collaboration with Faculty Instructors

- Informs Faculty of presence of APEX students and GradesFirst system
- Collaboration with Academic Depts. to help identify Facultyfit

Slightly reduced course load in first Fall semester

- Limit of 11 Credit hours in the first fall semester
- Financial aid used to offset penalty for less than full time enrollment.
- Limit is removed for subsequent semesters

Learning Communities Revisited-

 Grouping by career/major to promote earlier interaction w/Department Faculty & Advisors

Weekly Advisor-Attendance Reporting

 APEX is much more sensitive and responsive in tracking and monitoring student attendance to advising meetings

Academic Planning Documentation

 Students work with Advisor to plan out assignments and studying, review accomplishments

Monitored (and structured) Study Hours

 8-Hour On-campus study in UGL and APEX computer labs

Monitoring &
Communication
System

- Progress Reports in 3rd week, 8th week and 11th week
- Goes <u>directly</u> to APEX Advisors
- Informs discussion regarding study planning and enrollment strategy


More timely feedback to students on Success-oriented Compliance

- Automated reminders of APEX Advisor meetings
- Students are able to monitor their own study hours → better compliance


