## Summary of Student Code of Conduct Charges

The Student Conduct Officer is responsible for investigating alleged violations of the Code of Conduct (Code) and for coordinating the conduct process. This report reflects data for the **2015-2016 Academic Year** in comparison to the **2013-2014** and **2014-2015 Academic Years**.

The number of students charged with misconduct during the 2015-2016 Academic Year has increased by 31% from the previous reporting year. This increase is due, in part, to a unique case in which many students were charged concurrently for related violations.

Forty-three students were charged with misconduct during the 2013-2014 Academic Year (August 25, 2013--April 29, 2014). Sixty-eight students were charged with misconduct during the 2014-2015 Academic Year (August 24, 2014--May 5, 2015). Eighty-nine students were charged with misconduct during the 2015-2016 Academic Year (August 30, 2015--May 3, 2016).
