



OFFICE OF ALUMNI RELATIONS AND ANNUAL GIVING

- In collaboration with the Department of Athletics, the Office of Alumni Relations and Annual Giving hosted its first Alumni Pre-Game Social on February 2 at the Matthaei Athletic Complex. Alumni representing graduating classes from the last 20 years cheered on the WSU Women's & Men's Basketball teams against rival GVSU. Guests were treated to a buffet dinner, alumni association giveaways, special chairback seating in the President's section for both games, and an opportunity to meet and greet next season's incoming student athletes.
- The WSU Alumni Association Board of Directors met on February 9.
- The Office of Alumni Relations developed the framework for a new Student-Alumni Council and has launched marketing efforts of the application process to the student body. Selected student applicants will focus on engaging students in the life of the Alumni Association and priority annual giving activities (thank you notes to donors, alumni event ambassadors, crowdfunding advisors, and social media buzz-makers for WSU Giving Day). In addition, we plan to assemble a group of alumni volunteer advisors for this program in the coming months.
- The Office of Alumni Relations administered an alumni/donor survey on behalf of the university recently and is now aggregating the responses to help inform our future alumni programs and communications planning. The survey achieved a 2.8 percent response rate, slightly higher than the industry standard of 2.5 percent.
- In concert with Undergraduate Admissions, we are drafting the framework for a new Alumni Admissions Ambassador volunteer initiative, which we hope to launch by the end of the summer.
- The WSUAA is in close communication with the Organization of Black Alumni (OBA). We rebranded OBA in consultation with the alumni volunteer leaders for the group, and we are now working with the group to align future activities with the strategic objectives of the WSUAA.

- On January 13, the WSUAA was a Dream Supporter for the annual MLK Tribute Luncheon, honoring the memory of the Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. As part of the WSUAA sponsorship package, the association directly sponsored the attendance of eight students for the program and lunch.
- On February 16, the WSUAA hosted its second #WayneChat digital event. This online seminar featured Louis Patler, Ph.D. '72 as he spoke about entrepreneurship and his new book *Make Your Own Waves: The Surfer's Rules for Innovators and Entrepreneurs*.
- The WSUAA accepted formal nominations for the 2017 WSU Alumni Association Awards during the month of February. Two awards, the Distinguished Alumni Award and the Homer D. Strong Award, will be conferred during a special, oncampus event at the end of April.

REGIONAL PROGRAMMING HIGHLIGHTS:

- Alumni receptions were held this winter in:
 - Naples, Florida on February 15 at the Naples Botanical Gardens. President and Mrs. Wilson attended, and guests received a short program focused on recent university accomplishments and the status of the Pivotal Moments campaign.
 - Lakeland, Florida on March 18. More than 80 alumni attended the Detroit Tigers Spring Training Annual Alumni Event at Joker Marchant Stadium.
