### Student Conduct Overview for 2016-2017 Academic Year

The Student Conduct Officer is responsible for directing and coordinating matters involving student discipline, maintaining student conduct files, conducting fact-finding conferences with all accused students, and otherwise coordinating activities under the Student Code of Conduct (Board Statutes 2.31.02). The overview that follows reflects student conduct data for the 2016-2017 Academic Year (August 27, 2016 - May 1, 2017), relative to prior academic years.

During the 2016-2017 Academic Year, forty-five students were referred to the Dean of Students Office for alleged misconduct. The number of referrals has decreased by 51% from the previous reporting year. The decrease may be attributed in part to an atypical case from the 2015-2016 Academic Year in which a significant number of students were referred to the Dean of Students Office for related violations.
