DISCONTINUANCE OF THE POST BACHELOR CERTIFICATE IN INFORMATION SYSTEMS MANAGEMENT

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of Governors approve the discontinuance of the Post Bachelor Certificate in Information Systems Management offered by the Mike Ilitch School of Business, effective Fall 2019.

Background

This certificate program was established in the Fall, 2014 semester by the Mike Ilitch School of Business. There is no longer a demand for this certificate. Interested individuals can gain information systems management expertise via seminars and on-line training offered through private companies and employers. Currently, there are only 9 students in the Post Bachelor Certificate in Information Systems Management. All students currently in the certificate program will be allowed to complete the requirements for the certificate. Students will be allowed three years to complete the program requirements.

Program Description

The Post Bachelor Certificate in Information Systems Management was developed to give individuals a competitive advantage as a job-seeker, while teaching valuable skills.
