DISCONTINUANCE OF THE GRADUATE CERTIFICATE IN COMPLEMENTARY AND ALTERNATIVE MEDICINE (CAM)

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of Governors discontinue the Complementary and Alternative Medicine (CAM) Graduate Certificate program, effective Winter 2020.

Background

The program has been on moratorium for at least three years. No students have been enrolled in the certificate program since 2017, and no students are currently enrolled in this certificate program. One student completed the requirement of this certificate program in 2017 and will be awarded the certificate when the student completes the Doctor of Nursing Practice Program in Winter 2021.

Program Description

The CAM Graduate Certificate Program comprised a program offered by the College of Nursing to provide knowledge and skills for use of complementary and alternative therapies. The graduate certificate required a minimum of 12 credits.

Approvals

The recommendation to discontinue the certificate was approved by the Faculty of the College of Nursing, the Interim Dean of the College of Nursing, the Graduate Council, Dean of the Graduate School and the Interim Provost.
