
History: Who are we?

New BS-AHS Program


- Approved by WSU BOG in 2023

Undergraduate Enrollment: Increasing Dramatically Because of BS-AHS Program

- Goal was **20** students in 2024
- Program currently has 59 students
- 88% increase in applications and 141% increase in enrollment from 2023 to 2024





Graduation Rates

• FTIAC students who transferred into EACPHS:

- 4-year graduation rate of 81%
- 6-year graduation rate of 95.2%

*BS-AHS is the first program at the college to enroll students as freshman







Student Clinical Placements at Multiple Sites

- Many of these jobs are at the same sites as where they received their clinical training


